Bylaw No. 2020 - 10

R.M. of Edenwold No. 158

A Bylaw of the Hamlet of Emerald Park to Regulate the Operation of All Terrain Vehicles and Snowmobiles

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Edenwold No. 158 in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

- 1. In this bylaw, including this section:
 - a) "All Terrain Vehicle" and/or "ATV" means a self-propelled vehicle that:
 - i. is designed primarily for the movement of people or goods on unprepared surfaces, and
 - ii. has wheels in contact with the ground and without restricting the generality of the foregoing shall include:
 - 1. mini-bikes
 - 2. motorbikes
 - 3. all three and four wheeled vehicles in the nature of all terrain vehicles.
 - b) "Council" shall mean the Council of the RM of Edenwold No. 158.
 - c) "Municipality" shall mean the Rural Municipality of Edenwold No. 158
 - d) "Driver's License" means a driver's license issued pursuant to The Vehicle Administration Act.
 - e) "Registered" means registered pursuant to The Vehicle Administration Act.
 - f) "Snowmobile" shall have the same meaning as defined in The Snowmobile Act.
 - g) "Street" shall mean every highway, public road, street, avenue, lane drive or public place intended for use of vehicles.
 - h) "Hamlet" shall mean the Hamlet of Emerald Park, Province of Saskatchewan, in the Rural Municipality of Edenwold No. 158; as identified and outlined in red on Schedule "A"
 - "Administrator" shall mean the administrator of the Rural Municipality of Edenwold No. 158
 - j) "Designated Officer" shall mean an employee or agent of the Rural Municipality of Edenwold No. 158 appointed by Council.

2. ALL TERRAIN VEHICLE

2.1 REGULATIONS

- a) No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle within the Hamlet except as authorized pursuant to this bylaw.
- b) All terrain vehicles owned or leased by the Municipality and operated by employees of the Municipality are hereby permitted to operate in the Hamlet as required.
- c) No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle within the Hamlet unless the operator holds a valid driver's license and is insured against liability arising out of bodily injury to or the death of a person or loss or damage to property caused by the all terrain vehicle or the operation thereof as per the All Terrain Vehicle Regulations.

2.2 PERMITTED ROUTE

- a) The streets may be used by an operator of an all terrain vehicle but only for the purpose of traveling the most direct route between the place within the Hamlet where the all terrain vehicle is kept and an area outside of the Hamlet where it is intended to be used.
- b) The highway ditches may be used by an operator of an all terrain vehicle and all terrain vehicles may cross the highway or bridges for the purpose of traveling the most direct route between the place within the Hamlet where the all terrain vehicle is kept and an area outside of the Hamlet where it is intended to be used.

- c) No person shall ride, drive or operate an all terrain vehicle, in, across, upon or through any boulevard, park, playground, public reserve or any property owned or controlled by the Municipality.
- d) No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle on any street in the Hamlet except at a careful and prudent speed having regard to all the circumstances, but at no time shall exceed thirty (30) kilometers per hour.
- e) No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle within the Hamlet in such a manner as to create a nuisance or undue annoyance to residents or other persons in the Hamlet.
- f) No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle upon any property in such a manner that is dangerous to other persons or property.
- g) No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle so as to travel two (2) abreast on a street within the Hamlet.

2.3 PRIVATE PROPERTY

 a) Nothing in this Bylaw shall prevent a person from operating an all terrain vehicle on private property, if such operation is for the purpose of clearing and/or removing snow.

2.4 HOURS OF OPERATION

a) No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle within the Hamlet between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m.

3. SNOWMOBILE REGULATIONS

3.1 REGULATIONS

- a) No person shall operate a snowmobile within the Hamlet except as authorized pursuant to this bylaw.
- b) No person shall operate a snowmobile within the Hamlet unless the operator holds a valid driver's license and the snowmobile is registered.

3.2 PERMITTED ROUTE

- a) The streets may be used by an operator of a snowmobile but only for the purpose of traveling the most direct route between the place within the Hamlet where the snowmobile is kept and an area outside of the Hamlet where it is intended to be used.
- b) The highway ditches may be used by an operator of a snowmobile and snowmobiles may cross the highway or bridges for the purpose of traveling the most direct route between the place within the Hamlet where the snowmobile is kept and an area outside of the Hamlet where it is intended to be used.
- c) No person shall ride, drive or operate a snowmobile, in, across, upon or through any boulevard, park, playground, public reserve or any property owned or controlled by the Municipality.
- d) No person shall operate a snowmobile on any street in the Hamlet except at a careful and prudent speed having regard to all the circumstances, but at no time shall exceed thirty (30) kilometers per hour.
- e) No person shall operate a snowmobile within the Hamlet in such a manner as to create a nuisance or undue annoyance to residents or other persons in the Hamlet.
- f) No person shall operate a snowmobile upon any property in such a manner that is dangerous to other persons or property.
- g) No person shall operate a snowmobile so as to travel two (2) abreast on a street within Hamlet limits.

3.3 HOURS OF OPERATION

a) No person shall operate a snowmobile within the Hamlet between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m.

4. PENALTIES

a) A person contravening any provisions of this bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and is liable to a penalty of:

i. First offence \$ 250.00 ii. Second offence \$ 500.00 iii. Third offence \$ 1,000.00

- b) A person contravening any provisions of this bylaw with four or more offences shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Municipality.
- c) A person contravening any provisions of this bylaw who has been served with a summons ticket and the penalty amount is \$1,000.00 or less and who wishes to plead guilty and pay a voluntary payment within 14 days of the date of the summons ticket, may deliver the summons and an amount equal to 50% of the specified penalty sum for the offence to a place indicated on the summons ticket on or before the date specified on the summons.
