

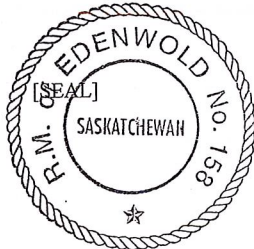


BYLAW NO 2018 - 21


A BYLAW TO RECOVER PROTECTIVE SERVICES COSTS  
FOR SECONDARY FIRE SERVICE CALLS

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Edenwold No. 158 in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. In this bylaw:
  - a) "Administrator" shall mean the administrator of the municipality;
  - b) "Council" shall mean the council of the municipality;
  - c) "Municipality" shall mean the Rural Municipality of Edenwold No. 158; and,
  - d) "City of Regina" shall mean the City of Regina Fire & Protective Services (RFPS).
2. The cost of fire prevention, suppression and emergency response services shall be charged directly on the persons who receive the service from the City of Regina in accordance with Schedule "A" which is attached to and forming part of this bylaw; and that Schedule "A" may be amended from time to time.
3. The Council may authorize the Administrator to add to the taxes of any property owned by the person referenced in Section 2 of this bylaw any amount which remains unpaid 60 days after the person has been invoiced for said services or at the end of the calendar year, whichever is earlier.
4. This bylaw shall come into force on the day of its final passing.

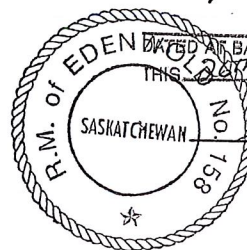

**SCHEDULE "A" TO BYLAW NO. 2018 – 21**

RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF EDENWOLD NO. 158

**RECOVERY OF PROTECTIVE SERVICES COSTS  
FOR SECONDARY FIRE SERVICE CALLS**

**Per Response Fees**

Per Response Fees are calculated based on the time each apparatus is deployed to an incident, until it returns to service within the City of Regina city limits. Fees are rounded up to the next half hour. A minimum of four (4) hours will be charged on each activation.

The fee shall be calculated in accordance with the following:

$(A + B) \times C =$  Per Incident Fee, where

A = First Class Firefighter Overtime rates x 4

B = RFPS' prior years approved operating budget, divided by (total firefighter strength as of January 1 of the current year, times average number of hours worked per firefighter per year): and

C = Number of Firefighters responding.

For illustration purposes only, the hourly rates are as follows for 2018:
