


Large bright orange butterfly with black veining on wings. Wings black bordered with two rows of white spots. Occurs in southern Saskatchewan where milkweed and wildflowers grow.

## Report any life stage!

Monarchs only lay their eggs on milkweed species, check the underside of leaves for tiny 1 mm eggs



Mature caterpillars choose locations on host milkweed or other wildflowers nearby to pupate. Monarch Chrysalis can remain for ~2 weeks before the adult butterfly emerges.



## Is that a Monarch?



The Viceroy is a tricky look-a-like to Monarchs.

Watch for the black band across the hindwings of the Viceroy to tell these two apart. When in doubt take a picture!
