

Parker Trimp and Brent Miller with the Ministry of Highways attended the council meeting in person along with Sylvia Marshall with the Ministry of Highways and Kerra Mruss, Keenan Anderson and Kristen Faber, consultants with WSP, who attended the council meeting via Microsoft. Teams to provide updates on Ministry of Highways construction projects scheduled to occur, the status of Highway 46 Functional Planning Study, and the projects listed on the Ministry of Highways' Safety Improvement Plan located within the RM of Edenwold.

The next steps in the Highway 46 Functional Planning Study include working on different staging options, short-term recommendations to the Ministry and virtual public engagement sessions, however, they were unable to provide specific timelines.

Council discussed the safety concerns of Highway 48 at Jameson Estates and at Range Road 2174A to the west. The Ministry advised Council they have identified that a turning lane is warranted at Jameson Estates along with a couple of other locations along Highway 48, however, they cannot commit to a specific timeline, but should be within the next 5 years. These projects are advanced in tandem with other major paving projects in the area. The Ministry of Highways advised that the public can call into their Customer Service Centre for issues on provincial highways at 1-844-754-4929.

Council also identified issues related to the traffic lights changing too quickly at the diverging diamond on the Pilot Butte Overpass. The Regina Bypass submits annual traffic signal reports to the Ministry and adjustments are made if necessary. The Ministry of Highways acknowledged they would look into this issue.

Discretionary Use Application: Commercial, Large Scale - 6 South Plains Road

THAT we approve the discretionary use application for a commercial, large-scale development and instruct the Development Officer to issue a permit for the use at 6 South Plains Road, Lot 14, Blk/Par 3, Plan 102234158 Ext 0 with the following conditions:

1. That the site is developed in accordance with the site plan attached to the permit allowing for a large-scale commercial business (grocery store). Any other proposed use will require a separate development permit or discretionary use development from Council.
2. Site grading, building elevations, culvert size and site drainage shall be in accordance with the site grading plan to be submitted to the RM for approval.
3. All existing features within the drainage swales shall be returned to their original condition upon completion of work.
4. The landowner shall locate all underground utilities and mains and protect utilities

from damage and shall return such utilities to their original condition upon completion of work.

5. The landowner must provide:
 - a. Payment to the municipality for all service connection fees.
 - b. That all mains, pipe fittings, valves, and equipment are installed in strict accordance with manufacturers' recommendations.
 - c. "As-built" drawings showing the location of water and sanitary sewer installed accompanied by Saskatchewan Health Authority approvals.
6. Construction of the building shall not proceed until the building permit has been issued.
7. Prior to use and occupancy, the Development Officer requires:
 - a. Confirmation that the civic address has been posted on the front of the building, visible from the street, is not obstructed from view, is not smaller than 8" in height, and is a contrasting color to the building to provide visual clarity.
 - b. "As-built" drawings showing that the site has been developed in accordance with conditions 1, 2, and 5c.
 - c. A landscape plan is to be submitted within six (6) months from the Development Permit approval date. All landscaping shown on the Landscape Plan shall be installed within two (2) years from the date of development permit approval.
8. No person shall cause or permit any lands or building to become untidy or unsightly (Bylaw No. 2023-18).
9. This permit is subject to the standards and requirements of Provincial regulations and other municipal bylaws.
10. Unloading and loading of equipment shall take place onsite. RM property and adjacent properties shall not be affected.
11. Access to the site will utilize/share the existing approach. No additional approaches will be permitted.
12. A Development Agreement may be required.

The Ministry of Environment has advised that the public review period is underway for the environmental impact statement (EIS) for Invenergy's proposed Lajord Renewable Energy Centre project. While the wind and solar project is mainly located on lands within the RM of Lajord, participating lands and infrastructure extend into the RM of Edenwold. Two quarter sections of land are in the RM of Edenwold and are proposed as solar. The 30-day review period began on January 11, 2025, and runs until February 11, 2025. It was noted that solar energy system (commercial) is a discretionary use under the RM's agricultural resource zoning district in the Zoning Bylaw and a discretionary use application would need to be submitted to the RM which includes a public hearing;
- advised of the upcoming SARM Annual Convention in March 2025 in Saskatoon;
- representatives from the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency will be a delegation at the RM's February 11, 2025 council meeting;
- update of the SARM rebate received for leafy spurge;
- advised of the upcoming Incident Command System (ICS) 402 training session scheduled for February 19, 2025 at the RM office;
- provided an update on the Division 1 candidate's application with the Court of King's Bench to contest the Division 1 election results and that the RM continues to wait for further developments to determine if the matter will proceed; and




