Cannabis Survey Summary The Cannabis Feedback Form results were reviewed by Council, 108 responses were received with the 2 prevalent concerns being (1) regulations, policing and how certain issues would be enforced and, (2) protecting the youth by keeping retail outlets away from schools or places where youths are frequently present. The majority of the issues and concerns brought forward by respondents will be addressed by the Federal and Provincial Government regulations.
