# Public Works Report: 9:03 a.m. to 9:32 a.m.

Public Works Foreman Rod Benroth presented the Public Works Report on the following topics:

- update on the Balgonie Grid (Grid 622) clay capping project;
- update on the South Service Road (Nutrien road) paving project;
- gravel crushing has been delayed and expected to start July 8, 2024;
- crosswalks to be installed on South Plains Road in Emerald Park by end of June (dependent on weather and Enbridge's availability as they must be on site during construction);
- crack sealing was delayed and expected to begin the week of June 17, 2024;
- dandelion spraying to begin the week of June 10th;
- major repairs to Rock Pointe road were delayed and expected to begin June 19, 2024;

- line painting of stop bars in the rural areas was delayed and will begin the week of June 10, 2024;
- updates on grading and gravelling of rural roads;
- dust control with magnesium chloride was delayed due to wet weather and will be applied between June 11 and 13, 2024;
- update on rural civic addressing project;
- culvert repairs and drainage issues;
- park maintenance updates;
- damage to windscreens at tennis/pickleball courts from high winds;
- asphalt millings will be placed in dog park when the dog park dries up;
- updates regarding the RM's operations of the water treatment and distribution systems, and the RM's wastewater system;
- hydrant flushing has been completed;
- update regarding the damaged fire hydrant in the Sleep Inn parking lot;

- waiting for updated quotes from SaskPower for streetlights on White City Drive and South Plains Road;

Council discussed the cost for keeping the clean-up bins for 6 months of the year. It was noted that most Emerald Park residents have green curbside compost carts and residents should be encouraged to use their carts regularly.

Council discussed the quote received for sound dampening panels for the tennis/pickleball court and cost of sound dampening balls for pickleball. The RM will purchase sound dampening balls and will have them available at the RM office for pickleball players and the RM will install additional signage at the tennis/pickleball court encouraging players use sound dampening balls.
